## HARRY ARMUTH KILLED

## AT PORTLAND, OREGON

Dalton community suffered a distinct shock last Saturday night when the announcement was made that Harry C. Armuth had been killed at 3 o'clock that afternoon while at work in Portland, Oregon. The message was received by Mr. and Mrs. Mark Iddings, of Bridgeport, parents of Mrs. Armuth, and they immediately brought it to Harry's father here. Mr. and Mrs. Armuth left at once for Bridgeport in order to get in wire communication with Harry's wife, and Sunday morning Mr. Armuth and Mr. Iddings left for Portland, following a long-distance telephone conversation with the widow, who stated that she desired the presence of the men there.

The telegram announcing the accidental death was sent to Mr. Iddings by "Billy" Bowman, close friend of Mr. and Mrs. Armuth. He accompanied them to Portland when they left here two years ago. At the time this article is written (Wednesday afternoon) no particulars were available on the accident which snuffed out the life of the young man, but it is known that Harry had been working in the shipyards where he held a foremanship.

Messrs. Armuth and Iddings arrived in Portland Wednesday mornand it was thought that they, accompanied by Mrs. Armuth, would return here with the body as soon as necessary details could be arranged. The party is not expected in Dalton before tomorrow, and it may possibly be later than that.

Harry passed his 21st birthday on October 31, and the position which he held in the shipyards was a dangerous one, but the future seemed to hold much for him.

Owing to the lack of knowledge as to the time of arrival of the sad party here, no arrangements can be made for the funeral. It is a most sad affair, and the young wife and the relatives of the young man are extended the heartfelt sympathy of many friends in their hours of distress.
